

Trauma-Informed Dialogue

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) defines trauma-informed approach as a strengths-based service delivery approach that is grounded in an understanding of and responsiveness to the impact of trauma, that emphasizes physical, psychological, and emotional safety for both providers and survivors, and that creates opportunities for survivors to rebuild a sense of control and empowerment. Trauma-Informed Dialogue (TID) emphasizes the techniques necessary to create a collaborative, client-centered approach. All TID dialogues should reflect the four key principles of the trauma-informed approach according to the National Center for Trauma-Informed Care (NCTIC):

1. **REALIZE** the widespread impact of trauma and understand potential paths for recovery;
2. **RECOGNIZE** the signs and symptoms of trauma in people using services, their families, staff, and others involved with the system;
3. **RESPOND** by fully integrating knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, and practices; and
4. **RESIST** re-traumatization.

The TID training will explore the role of the advocate and identify how to handle post-trauma responses from survivors. It will also explain the importance of strategically and transparently asking questions using the OARS (open-ended, affirmations, reflections and summarizations) method.
