Fiscal Year 2017-2018

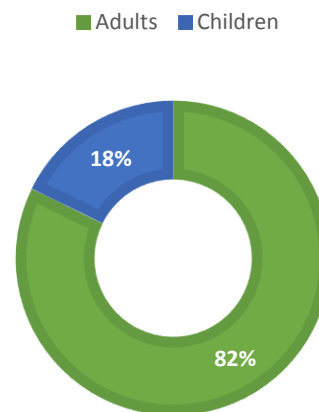
Domestic violence programs are a vital resource, providing free and confidential assistance to victims and survivors of domestic violence and their children.

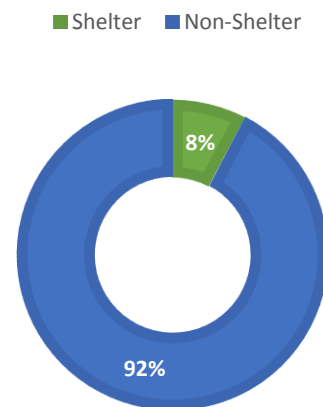
