## MISSION

The mission of the West Virginia Coalition Against Domestic Violence (WVCADV) is to **end personal and institutional violence in the lives of people of all genders and ages.**

We work to transform social, cultural, and political attitudes through public awareness, policy development, community organizing, education and advocacy in ways that promote values of respect, mutuality, accountability and non-violence in local, statewide, national and global communities.

## VISION

WVCADV is founded on the vision and belief that **every person has the right to be safe, empowered, and free from violence and the fear of violence.**

Central to this belief, we seek to **eliminate domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, dating violence and human trafficking.** Additionally, the agency aims to reduce related social problems, such as child abuse, substance use, sexism, racism, and other forms of oppression.

## WHAT WE DO



### **Training & Technical Assistance**

Our strength is our network of the 14 licensed domestic violence programs. We provide comprehensive specialized technical assistance, and training to domestic violence programs and numerous agencies in order to best address the needs of victims and survivors.



### **Community Organizing**

We are a conduit for social change efforts and collaboration. We create spaces and opportunities for advocates and community members to expand their knowledge, attitudes and skills to better serve people who are marginalized and/or oppressed.

## **Public Policy**



We represent victims, survivors, and advocates on policy and legislative issues to keep the goal of ending domestic violence a statewide priority. We work closely with domestic violence programs to make sure ongoing and emerging needs are heard and understood by policymakers.

## **Public Awareness**



Public awareness is a core element of any successful anti-violence strategy. Our efforts educate the community on the dynamics of domestic violence, how to get help, available services, and how to support our efforts.

## OUR IMPACT

# 460 Individualized Technical Assistance Sessions



We provided 460 sessions of in-depth problem-solving and support to WV domestic violence programs, allied agencies, and survivors, addressing specific, complex issues that cross our multiple areas of expertise.



# 1,946 People Trained

More than 1,900 people brought critical information and skills back to their colleagues, coworkers, and communities after attending WVCADV trainings.

# 490 Community Education Hours



We dedicated over 400 hours engaging directly with local and statewide people to provide domestic violence awareness.



## **4,992 Website Visitors**

Nearly 5,000 people visited WVCADV.org to find resources and learn about our work over the year, averaging more than 400 unique monthly visitors. Domain authority has improved over the last year from 19 to 36.

## **10,024 Reached with Social Media**



Awareness and education efforts on social media include one or more posts per day with a monthly reach of more than 2,500 people. Videos and reels produced an average of more than 200 views each, and top performing posts routinely reach more than 350 people.

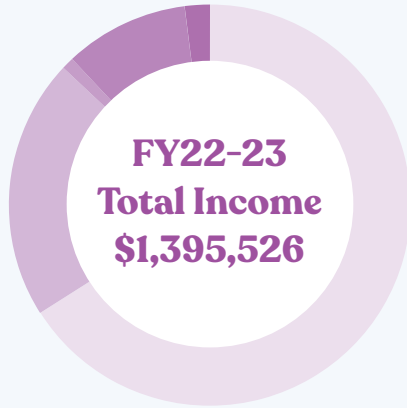
